

# **Emergency Rental Assistance Program**

- What: \$20 million program to help residents and landlords amid the coronavirus crisis; second phase of city program launched mid-2020
  - > See Emergency Rental Assistance Program Phase I below
- **How:** eligible applicants can receive up to 80 percent of total unpaid rent from April 1, 2020, through March 31, 2021
- Eviction protections: renters are able to defer rent under the state's eviction moratorium through June 30, 2021
- · Landlord, renter assistance:
  - If landlord agrees to forgive 20 percent of unpaid rent, in line with state eviction moratorium, city will grant remaining 80 percent owed by tenant directly to landlord
  - If landlord does not participate, tenant can receive direct grant of 25 percent of outstanding rent due
- Funding: Federal Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 and state rental assistance money allocated directly to Anaheim; total \$21.6 million
- Council approval: Feb. 16, 2021
- Application period: March 1-31, 2021
- How to apply:
  - Submit online application at Anaheim.net/rentassistance
  - o Provide proof of current income
  - o Provide proof of rent owed
  - o Provide copy of current lease



# **Emergency Rental Assistance Program**

- Who: Anaheim residents who have reduced income or job loss due to the coronavirus crisis; prioritization based on percent of area median income, or AMI
  See Area Median Income below
  - First priority: Household income at or below 50 percent AMI and one member of household unemployed for past 90 days or more
  - Second priority: Household income at or below 50 percent AMI or one member of household unemployed for past 90 days or more
  - o Third priority: Household income at or below 80 percent AMI
- Repeat applicants: residents who received assistance in the first phase of Anaheim's program can reapply for additional aid in second phase
- Future allocation: after initial round of assistance for rent due, program could expand to assist with ongoing and future rent payments and utilities
- Area Median Income: based on 2020 median annual income for Orange County of \$103,000 for a family of four
  - o 80 percent AMI: \$102,450 annual income
  - o 50 percent AMI: \$64,050 annual income

#### Deadlines:

- o 65 percent of \$11.2 million in state funds must be allocated by June 1, 2021
- o 65 percent of \$10.4 million in federal funds must be allocated by Sept. 31, 2021
- o All funds must be allocated by Dec. 31, 2021

### Program administration:

- Staffing: contracts for staffing to assist city in processing applications and awarding funds quickly; funded by portion of state, federal allocation permitted for administration costs
  - \$1 million: contract with Protiviti Government Services for staffing; company used by city of Los Angeles rental assistance program
  - \$600,000: increased contract with Comprehensive Housing Services Inc. for continued assistance with program administration
- Streamlined process: improvements and reduced requirements to make program more accessible to renters
- o City hotline: providing added help for applicants



### **Emergency Rental Assistance Program: Phase I**

- What: \$5 million program for residents struggling amid the coronavirus crisis to pay back rent deferred under Anaheim's eviction moratorium, or state and federal eviction protections
- Approved: May 5, 2020, additional funds added Aug. 11, 2020, by Anaheim's City Council as part of the Anaheim Community and Economic Recovery Plan
- Funding: federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, money allocated under the Anaheim Community and Economic Recovery Plan
- Total assistance given in two rounds: \$1.4 million
- Helped: 736 households
  - o First round: 463
  - o Second round: 273
- Application period:
  - o First round: June 1-5, 2020
  - o Second round: Sept. 30-Oct. 16, 2020
- Applicants: 1,446 households
  - o First round: 894 o Second round: 552
- Rental assistance: up to \$2,100 per household
  - o Back rent repayment: help paying back rent deferred since April 2020
  - Meeting current rent: up to three months of help at \$700 a month, or, if lower, the difference between 40 percent of current monthly income and rent
  - Combination: help for both current and back rent due, up to \$2,100 per household
- Who: Anaheim renters who lost jobs or work hours due to the economic or health impacts of coronavirus and who meet income and rent cost requirements
  - > See income, rent cost limits below



## **Emergency Rental Assistance Program: Phase I**

#### Income:

- o Household income of \$102,450 or less for a family of four
- Household cash, savings and other readily accessible assets of \$10,000 or less
- Rent cost limits: less than 120 percent of fair market value rents for Anaheim

0	Studio	\$1,875
0	One bedroom	\$2,145
0	Two bedroom	\$2,660
0	Three bedroom	\$3,720
0	Four bedroom	\$4,295

#### · Not eligible:

- Those receiving other government or nonprofit rent assistance
- Those living in a house or apartment with any form of rent subsidies, such as Anaheim's Housing Choice Voucher Program
- Those living in temporary housing
